FROM THE DESK OF THE DIRECTOR



Big news! Humanities Montana, Montana's independent, non-profit affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities, designated Sidney as its Hometown Humanities community for 2017/2018! The MonDak Heritage Center, along with the Sidney Area Chamber of Commerce & Agriculture, applied for Hometown Humanities earlier this year with the support of local schools and other groups and businesses. The Hometown Humanities project will bring a year's worth of humanities-based programming to the Sidney area. All programs will be FREE and open to the public!

MDHC is already working with our local partners to discuss and plan the types of programs to bring to the area to best benefit local students and residents and spark dialogue within the community. 

The Williston Area Visual Artists (WAVA) show features artwork
in different mediums from artists in and around Williston, North
Dakota. This year's show includes many artists' interpretations



of club challenges. Each artist received a square or two of a painting to complete that when put together became "The Scream" by Norwegian artist Edvard Munch. For another challenge artists submitted pieces of their favorite era. ELIZABETH DOVE: *IT STARTED WITH AARDVARK*OCTOBER 17—DECEMBER 30

It Started with Aardvark by artist Elizabeth Dove is a series of twenty -six screenprints, one for each letter of the alphabet. It includes every illustration from the dictionary, with these images organized

by letter. These screenprints do not portray the 3,100 dictionary illustrations as separate images as they are in the dictionary volume, but instead, overlap them in successive layers printed one on top of another so that they co-exist as one merged graphic icon, a hybrid of all visual knowledge. *It Started with Aardvark* is a project is about the search for meaning. This series of prints shows what the accumulation of knowledge and the ideal of complete understanding can look like within this search for meaning, and how a viewer deciphers and makes sense of visual information in our image-saturated contemporary world.

LEITH DEWEESE: VIEW FROM THE HIGH PLAINS NOVEMBER 14—JANUARY 13

View from the High Plains features watercolor paintings from artist Leith DeWeese. Using watercolor, Leith has developed a unique touch. According to DeWeese, "Growing up in the west creates a



sense of place in each of us. There are particular locations that we remember, sites with open vistas, clean air and a reverence for nature." The exhibit is sponsored by the North Dakota Art Gallery Association.

27TH ANNUAL MINIATURE ART SHOW NOVEMBER 14—JANUARY 20

The Miniature Art Show returns for its 27th year at the MonDak! One of the best and most anticipated shows every year, it highlights artists' amazing ability to produce detail and vision on a small scale. Artists are restricted to creating works no larger than $5'' \times 7''$ and many produce work far smaller, sometimes as small as a postage stamp. The show

Research Spotlight

by the MDHC Volunteers

While doing genealogy research, our volunteers came across the below poem by John Oscar Helm, who lived and worked in the MonDak area.

John was born February 19, 1871, in Stockholm, Sweden. He came to America when he was 24 years old. He worked in Minnesota and then Galesburg, North Dakota, where he met and married Anne Erickson in January 1903. They came to the Dore area and filed on some of the Buford Military Preserve and built a log house. They had three children (two boys and a girl).

John freighted from Mondak to Glendive for several years. He also helped build the ditch for the Lower Yellowstone Irrigation Project.

John passed away December 9, 1938, and his wife died on May 14, 1945.

I would sing of the hills of the opposite shore That carry abundance of coal there in store. The wood crested river would make it alone An Eden of Beauty: the Great Yellowstone.


