LOWER YELLOWSTONE IRRIGATION PROJECT THRU NOVEMBER 21

"The Lower Yellowstone Project was authorized by the Secretary of the Interior in 1904. The Project was designed to provide a dependable supply of irrigation water to support approximately 54,000 acres of land located on the west side of the Yellowstone River. Approximately two-thirds of the irrigated lands are in Montana with the remaining lands located in North Dakota.





Construction of the Project began in 1905, which included Intake Diversion Dam, which was also known as Yellowstone River Diversion Dam, a wood and stone diversion dam that spans the Yellowstone River and is submerged under water year-round."










GENEALOGY 101 CLASS NOVEMBER 21 1 - 4PM
