

"COFLOURISH: ART & RESILIENCY DURING THE PANDEMIC FEBRUARY 1ST-APRIL 1ST. 2023

This exhibit is a merger of two exhibitions that came out of the pandemic. One is CoLab MT+, a collaborative project where Open AIR paired artists together from Montana and beyond to connect and create together during the pandemic. The second is Flourish, an exhibition that featured works created by the Open AIR Artists-in-Residence created during their place-based residencies in various parts of Montana.

Together these exhibits show a manifestation of triumph and creativity in Montana during a historic and deeply challenging time for the world. It would be wonderful to have the opportunity to inspire fellow Montana's with the depth and breadth of creativity demonstrated in this exhibit.

LINDA OLSON CERAMICS EXHIBIT

APRIL 4—MAY 6TH 2023



Linda Olson teaches as a full professor at Minot State University, as she has since 1990. She chaired the Humanities Division at Minot State University from 2006 to 2015. Olson states, "I am a maker. I love making objects. I get lost in the process, and I find getting lost the most important aspect of making.

Art objects in history and antiquity, and thus Museums, are a primary inspiration for my work. Chinese celadon vessels, Greek amphoras and Japanese tea bowls are some of the areas that inform my own ceramic making."
