

NEW SUMMER EVENT AT THE MONDAK HERITAGE CENTER!



The MonDak Heritage Center is celebrating summer with a new, free, family event, *The MonDak Summer Bash & Bake Off*, on June 24th! This is going to be a fun-filled day with everything from storytelling to pie eating! Starting in the morning, register for Genealogy 101. In this workshop, participants will learn how to research their family history. This class will also include a workshop from professional storyteller Mo Reynolds on how to create and tell your family story. Mo will lead the group in a process that will take family information from research to story!

At 1pm, the Summer Bash & Bake Off officially begins! Bring a baked good (or two) and enter in the Bake Off while listening to local musicians play together in a jam session! All baked goods will be judged and prizes will be awarded to the winner of each category

and to an overall Grand Champion! Once items are judged, everyone will be able to purchase a sample of these delicious treats and buy raffle tickets to take home an entire winning dessert!

At 2 pm, be ready to cheer on local celebrities and heroes in the Pie Eating Contest! The goal of this contest is to eat an entire pie as fast as possible with no hands. Participants include a MDHC Board member, deputy sheriff, police officer, fireman, and the Mayor of Sidney. Then at 3pm, Mo Reynolds will be onstage engaging and amazing the audience with her stories of folk tales and fables! In Mo's presentation, the audience is a part of the story. Come witness the connection between personal narratives and imagination!

While at the Summer Bash & Bake Off, be sure to glaze a ceramics project for only \$10! This walk-in class is perfect for all ages. Participants will choose a ceramic item from the wide selection from pickups to unicorns and glaze the project. MDHC staff will fire the projects and individuals can pick them up the following week.





Montana Shakespeare in the Parks FREE. EVERY SUMMER



"Courage Enough" Carol Hartman

JUNE 7—AUGUST 26



Born and raised in Charley Creek, Carol graduated from Sidney Senior High. Her formal art training came from Montana State University in Bozeman, and from California State University in Fresno. After teaching at CSU-Fresno, and exhibiting both paintings and installations both at home and abroad, Carol returned to Montana several years ago to paint full-time.

Hartman's "Courage Enough" exhibition features the landscapes inspired by the stories of the MDHC's "Courage Enough" book and the people and places of Montana. Come view her amazing works featuring homesteads and landscapes from the MonDak region! She uses imagery and

experiences from early years on a rural Montana ranch that have formed deep pockets of memories for her. Carol enjoys painting large landscape scenes using oils and oil pigment sticks.



Montana by Food

The tradition of food is woven through almost every part of our heritage and history. It is almost impossible to think about a family memory, a cultural tradition, or a community event without thinking about the food associated with its success. From brandings to community gatherings, food was and still is an integral part of our heritage.



In this exhibit , the MDHC will display the Montana Historical Society's

"Montana by Food" exhibit. This exhibit features photos and recipes of our Montana homestead heritage. As part of this exhibit, the MDHC will also have on display artifacts and items from the MDHC collection related to the MonDak's culinary past. Come see the waffle iron that was used at the O'Brian Stagestop and many other historical cooking items.

Featured Exhibits

"MONTANA FABRIC" PAT OLDING

JULY 5—AUGUST 26



Pat Olding is a palette knife painter and outdoor enthusiast whose paintings come to life with beautiful lighting, lush streaks of color and texture. Oldiing describes her paintings as, "I paint Montana, from the ivory rump elk and dusty cowboy, to the glistening trout-filled rivers. My enthusiasm for the outdoors led me to Red Lodge, Montana where in.my studio I listen to the thundering Rock Creek and watch the sun's colors caress the Beartooth Mountains. My paintings have transformed from still life and urban landscape to portraying subjects of Montana, rodeo action, wild and ranch animals plus breath-taking vistas.

Olden "Montana Fabric" exhibition is designed

to create a path to discovery for the viewer. The paintings are primarily comprised of two unlikely compositional elements, majestic Montana animals and precise quilt or fabric designs. She explains, "The concept for this show came about after reading that Sidney, Montana women (like many other American women) created quilts for auction during WWII. The proceeds were used to buy cigarettes and candies for the soldiers. These unsung talents were used to support the war effort. I thought if I recognized these efforts with some of the most majestic elements of Montana, they should and would be seen as equal threads of the fabric. By doing this I am also hoping viewers will recognize all the talents, all the efforts and all the treads that make the Montana Fabric.
