Featured Exhibits

"Dramatic Moments: Frederic Remington's Early Engravings" Curated by Lee Silliman

JANUARY 16—MARCH 30



This exhibit presents an outstanding collection of large-size, vintage Harper's Weekly engravings by Frederic Remington. These are the images that launched Remington's illustration career, and that provided the platform from which he evolved into one of the West's most famous fine art painters. The images not only document Remington's rise to

prominence and wealth, but also chronicle the convulsive events in the closing decades

of the western frontier era. Furthermore, Remington's consummate skill in rendering the horse in motion is prominently demonstrated in these engravings. This extensive body of Frederic Remington's early art forms is a testament to his emergent skill and creative imagination, traits which quickly elevated him above and beyond his contemporaries.



"RHYTHM AND WHIMSY" RICHARD SWANSON FEBRUARY 7—APRIL 26

Richard Swanson began this series of small-scale metal sculptures in 2013 after a decade of creating monumental public sculpture. The intimate scale of this body of work offers a level of spontaneity difficult to achieve in larger works, reflecting a freer use of color, form and line, embracing an improvisational and syncopated style of working that is as much about process and play as the final product. Swanson considers these sculptures visual poems whose colorful rhythms suggest a story or fragment of a dream.





With a large portion of his career dedicated to large scale and public works, Swanson explores space and scale freely, using size to either envision the individual works as studies for larger pieces, or as playful poetic quips standing complete all on their own.

Rhythm and Whimsy illustrates Swanson's understanding of line, form, balance and rhythm to create three-dimensional line drawings that bounce brightly like jazz phrases – no hidden meanings but spontaneous and lyrical, with the interval between notes as essential as the notes themselves.

"THE ODYSSEY OF MONTANA'S THOMAS FRANCIS MEAGHER" STEPHEN GLUECKERT

FEBRUARY 7—MARCH 30



To describe Meagher's life-journey as an odyssey is not an exaggeration. Like the legendary Odysseus, he was blown by the winds of war and fate to the four corners of the earth. Art engages the heart as well as the mind and is one

of the most effective ways to engross an audience, pique their interest, and increase their awareness of history. As you spend time with Stephen Glueckert's expressive oil pastel drawings you will feel the danger, energy, and emotion of Meagher's odyssey.

Glueckert's 24 colorful vignettes are filled with the celestial, earthly, and man-made symbols that governed Meagher's life: from his privileged upbringing in Ireland to his leadership in the Young Irelander Rebellion, to impressment and escape, to his time as a commander in the Civil War, to finally his mysterious death. Though Meagher's time in Montana was short, he remains a source of Irish pride in our state and his story continues to capture the imaginations of Montanans of all types.
